GETTING STARTED!!!

For most of us, talking to others about Jesus is tough.

We don't know what to say, and no one likes to look dumb. Everyone fears rejection, and talking about God feels like one of these subjects that will end up isolating us from others. Why would Jesus call us to be the light in a dark world when it can be so tough?

Shining bright doesn't begin with our mouth.

It starts in our heart, works its way out to our hands, and when the time is right, we need to speak up. Evangelism (sharing our faith with others) is a lifestyle, not a few isolated events.

Evangelism begins with a compassionate heart.

"When [Jesus] saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." (Matthew 9:36)

True compassion is expressed in servant action.

"For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45)

To develop a compassionate heart, to become more like Jesus, we need to spend time with him. When we spend time with God through prayer and scripture, we will begin to see the world as he sees the world. As we develop our perspective, we discover practical ways to help people around us.

Evangelism isn't about accosting strangers.

Christians aren't called to be obnoxious and offensive. We are called to care for the world and to serve people around us. This is what Jesus did, and we're called to follow his example.

SOME THINGS TO HELP YOU!!!

Talking to your friends ought to be real, natural, and personal:

- **REAL**: you don't have to change who you are in order to share your faith
- **NATURAL**: it's a part of the friendships you already have established
- PERSONAL: it's all about sharing about what God has done in your life

Here are a series of "baby steps" to help you talk about Jesus to your friends:

- 1. Tell them that you are a Christian.
- 2. Invite your friend to a weekend service.
- 3. Talk about what you love about being a Christian.
- 4. Share your story about how you decided to begin taking God seriously.
- 5. Ask them if they want to know Jesus personally.

God uses ORDINARY PEOPLE to make an EXTRAORDINARY IMPACT for his kingdom:

"Now as they observed the confidence of Peter and John and understood that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were amazed and began to recognize them as having been with Jesus." (Acts 4:13)

How does this make you feel? What was the "secret" behind the confidence of Peter and John? How could you build that same thing into your own life?

SALT and LIGHT CHALLENGE

The Salt and Light Challenge is a commitment to change your world.

Why?

- Because Jesus lived a perfect life, died for the sins of the world and defeated death.
- Because most of the people we know don't believe Jesus is the savior we ALL need.
- Because we will grow closer to God when we talk about him with non-believers.

Sharing your faith with your friends doesn't happen in a single conversation. It's a lifestyle characterized by love. When we love like Jesus, we will have opportunities to talk about him.

The Salt and Light Challenge is a commitment to a process:


PRAY for five friends who don't know Jesus **SERVE** them in practical ways **SPEAK UP** when the time is right to have a spiritual conversation
